FOOD RESILIENCE MANDATE




- To increase agricultural productivity, income and nutrition of poor urban households, and improving nutrition for vulnerable groups.

FOOD GADERNS

HOMESTEAD GARDENS

- Gardens are established at back of the yard from the size of the door upwards
- City donate seeds and tools to households for establishment of gardens

COMMUNAL GARDENS

- Gardens are established throughout the City using vacant spaces, schools clinics and dumping sites
- Communal gardens are runned by registered cooperatives and sell their produce to different markets

AUQUARPONIC / GREENHOUSE

- New innovation to ensure that food production takes place in CBD
- Hydroponic farming system is the proffered method to save water











URBAN AGRICULTURE PROGRAMME



1. FOOD EMPOWERMENT ZONES/AGRI-PARKS

- The City has established a system of food empowerment zones to be determined by market need on an annual basis. These are established on city-owned land and include the following elements:
 - A large farm of at least 05 hectares under cultivation established via competitive proposal call with private sector partners.
 - Four food empowerment zones have been established in the City ranging from 5ha to 270ha







2. AGRI-RESOURCE CENTRES

- Serve as a point of access for all communities in the region who need information on food gardening, farming and access to land.
- Provide market intelligence (in consultation with the hub-and-spoke sites) on long-run prices and demand for different categories of product to guide site use and product composition decisions
- Assist all the farms and small gardens in the region through outreach officers.
- Seven (7) Agri-resource centres an satellites' offices have been established in all regions across the City to provide tractor services, access to land, cooperative registrations, training and workshops, advisory services and agricultural inputs

3. ORGANIC FARMING PROJECT- UNEP/GEF



- One (1) million dollar has been made available to the city to implement the project
- Almost ten 10 cooperatives with 1ha each are under incubation for the period of 5 years
- All ten farms should be certified by organic certification body and supply organic markets such as Woolworths and Brianstein organic markets





4. BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT SERVICES




- Assist cooperatives with compliance to regulations and legislations e,g tax return, annual returns to CIPC.

5. LEARNING ACADEMY

Learning Academy (LA) to provide the followings training services with assistance from various sponsors;



- The desk fundraise and network with potential funders on skill development for food security and Urban agriculture programme. g GDARD, UNEP, United ways, SAKATA.
- Annual training plans are designed specifically for smallholders farmers benefiting from food resilience program.
- More than 1000 beneficiaries have received one or more of the capacity building services

AGRO-PROCESSING PROGRAMME

1. FRUITS, HERBS AND VEG PROCESSING

Provide support to small scale agro processors who are involved in processing of various agricultural products such as fruits, milk, herbs and vegetables into juices, cheese, atchar, sauces, dried fruits and pesto

2. MOBILE CHICKEN ABBATOIR

- Mobile chicken abattoir with
 the slaughtering capacity of 1000
 birds has been established to assist
 broiler farmers to add value to their
 products before supply various
 markets across the city
 The abattoir is by 11 broiler famers
- at Eikenhoff farm





AGRI-HUBS & SPOKES

- ➡The City has created a minimum of two hubs serving small farms within the City of Joburg, linking to the hubs as a central point in region A and G
- This central point includes a range of services that support all the small farms linked to the hub and enable them to operate as if they were one large farm.
- The hubs and spokes are used as processing and market day centres for smallholder farmers and for selling of different vegetables to the communities.
